

LARRABEE DEBUTS KOZO PRINTS AT ARCHITECTURAL DIGEST SHOW IN NYC

Fine art and portrait photographer Ben Larrabee will display his imagery at the ninth annual Architectural Digest Home Design Show from March 18 through 21, at Pier 94 in New York City.

Larrabee's limited-edition photographs will be featured at booth No. 136 in the MADE section of the show, a juried selection of exhibitors presenting original fine art objects and furnishings all for purchase.

Debuting at the Show are Larrabee's articulated Kozo paper prints of nudes and horses. Larrabee pushes the boundaries of two-dimensional photography by infusing new life and energy into the traditional print. Each piece is individually shaped and contoured by the artist on Japanese mulberry paper. In addition, prints of landscapes, interiors and nudes are available for viewing. Special pricing on all prints is offered during the four days of the show.

Also on display are examples of Larrabee's Moments of Grace commissioned family portraiture. Larrabee is dedicated as an artist to recognizing and recording those fleeting, yet memorable glimpses of life that we take for granted, moments every family has but rarely sees revealed in photographs. Potential clients will have the opportunity to meet with the artist to learn about his approach to a family portrait session, fees, and in-home consultation services.

Larrabee's formal training as an artist began in 1962 at the Rhode Island School of Design, where he discovered his passion through his mentor, world-renowned photographer Harry Callahan, and earned a bachelor's degree in photography. In 1978, he continued his studies at Yale University, where he earned a master's degree in graphic design.

Larrabee's work, commissioned and personal, are in many private collections, as well as in the permanent collections of the George Eastman House, Rochester; the High Museum, Atlanta; the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston; and the Museum of Modern Art, New York.
